

ubtitled *Omaggio a Boccherini* ("Homage to Boccherini") this work is the Italian composer's answer to Andrés Segovia's request for a large, four-movement sonata. In this sonata, Castelnuovo-Tedesco's tribute to Boccherini's Rococo graciousness is echoed in the first and third movements, while the second movement is imbued with romanticism and the fourth with the *bravura* passages abundant in Boccherini's music. In the entire sonata the composer makes "technical demands on the player which cover the entire fingerboard. The texture is noticeably denser, more resonant than that of the Spanish composers." (Wade, 1980)

FURTHER LISTENING

Castelnuovo-Tedesco was fond of his monumental collection of twenty-four Capriccios based on the numerous prints of Spanish painter Francisco Goya. It is followed by Gilardino's sonata, the first movement of which pays homage to Castelnuovo-Tedesco. The last two pieces are the latter's Éclogues with its unusual instrumentation and his wonderful *Concerto*.
